STATEMENT IN OPEN COURT

1. My Lord, in this action for misuse of private information, I appear on behalf of the Claimant, Ms Jade Davidson. My learned friend, Ben Silverstone, appears on behalf of the Defendant, News Group Newspapers Limited.
2. The Claimant is a private individual. She is also an actress and sister to the actresses Holly Davidson and Sadie Frost as well as being the former sister-in-law to the actor Jude Law. The Claimant is also a former nanny to Lila Grace Moss Hack, who is the daughter of the model Kate Moss. As a result of the Claimant's high profile relationships she was a person of interest to the press.
3. The Defendant was the publisher of the *News of the World* which, until its closure in July 2011, was the UK's biggest selling Sunday newspaper with a very considerable readership in this jurisdiction. The Defendant was, and remains, the publisher of *The Sun* which still enjoys a substantial circulation and readership in this jurisdiction both in the hard copies of its publications and on its website.

4. In December 2019, the Claimant issued proceedings against the Defendant. Ms Davidson claimed that her voicemail messages were intercepted by the Defendant's journalists and that as a result, these journalists would have been privy to her private and confidential voicemail messages left on her mobile telephone by others.
5. The Claimant identified a number of articles that were published by the Defendant's newspapers between 2000 and 2010 which she claimed contained private information about her and those closest to her. During this time, the Claimant claimed that she used her voicemail extensively and she would regularly receive and leave voicemail messages.
6. The Claimant further claimed that as a result of these publications, she became suspicious as to who might be the source of the private information that was being published by the Defendant's newspapers and it was alleged that the articles generated mistrust within her circle of close friends and family.
7. The Claimant is pleased to confirm that she has accepted the Defendant's offer to resolve her claim on terms confidential between the parties, but which involve the Defendant agreeing to pay substantial damages to her as well as her reasonable legal costs of bringing the claim. The Defendant has also provided the necessary undertakings to the Court and the Claimant, and it has agreed to join in this statement to apologise to the Claimant publicly for the distress caused to her by the invasion of her privacy by individuals working for or on behalf of the *News of the World*. The Defendant makes no admission of liability in relation to the Claimant's allegations of voicemail interception and/or other unlawful information gathering at *The Sun*.

8. My Lord, on behalf of the Defendant, I confirm everything my learned Friend has said.
9. The Defendant is here today, through me, to offer its sincere apologies to the Claimant for the distress caused to her by the invasion of her privacy by individuals working for or on behalf of the *News of the World*. The Defendant acknowledges that such activity should never have taken place, and that it had no right to intrude into the private life of the Claimant in this way.
